

CANADA EMERGENCY WAGE SUBSIDY (CEWS) - CALCULATOR AND PORTAL UPDATE

On Tuesday, Prime Minister Trudeau announced that organizations will be able to apply online starting Monday April 27th for the **Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS)**. A few items to note ahead of the application date:

- 2. Eligible Employees

 - Please note that the eligibility in a period may be compromised if there was a period of 14 or more consecutive days in that period where they did not receive eligible pay by you.
 - Retroactive hiring If you have laid off an employee, you can hire them back retroactively and pay them retroactively. This will qualify for the subsidy. Please note you must pay the employees for the amounts to be included in the subsidy.
 - Non-arm's length employees non-arm's length employees must have been on payroll during the period of January 1 March 15th to qualify for the subsidy.
 - If the employee received CERB during the same period the employer is using CEWS, the employee maybe required to repay the CERB at a future date.

3. Calculating the Subsidy

- You will be asked to enter the number of eligible employees and the gross payroll.
- An excel spreadsheet is available to compute the subsidy refer to the blue button in section 2.b. "Calculate the values using the spreadsheet" using the link above
- Information you will need:

- Pre-crisis wages this is the average weekly (or bi-weekly gross pay) from January 1 – March 15, 2020.
- You can calculate the subsidy using one of two tabs:
 - Weekly (52) use this tab for weekly pay or other pay periods such as bimonthly, monthly
 - Bi-Weekly (every 2 weeks) use this tab for bi-weekly

How to use the spreadsheet:

- Line 3 you can enter the # of employees and the gross payroll for these employees that will qualify for the maximum. If their gross weekly payroll is greater than \$1,129, you can group these employees in one batch
- Line 4 If the employees qualify for 75% of their gross payroll as their gross weekly payroll is less than \$1,129, you can enter these employees in a batch. This would be the case if the pre-crisis wages are the same as the wages in the subsidy period. If the wages in the subsidy period are lower, use the detailed calculation starting on line 8.
- Line 8 and below use this area for all other employees. That would include employees whose pre-crisis wages are greater than the subsidy period. This would also include non-arm's length employees. In column G, you would note YES if they are non-arm's length and NO if they are not at arm's length. If you have a small number of employees, you can enter all employees starting on line 8 and below. You do not need to use line 3 or 4.
- Once you have completed the Weekly tab or the Bi-weekly tab, the totals will summarize on the tab "Instruction and results".

 - Follow the instructions on the website and enter the data from the spreadsheet.
 - Only use section 3 premiums and contributions if you have furloughed an employee (they are staying home with pay).
 - Step 4 if you previously claimed the 10% temporary wage subsidy, enter this amount here.
 - Step 5 calculate the subsidy. Print this page and have it ready for the application process.
